

Dogs Must Be on Leashes

If you are a dog owner, or have visitors who are dog owners, please make yourself aware of your legal and personal responsibilities, per the Town of Carbondale Leash Law. Owners in violation of this Ordinance are subject to citations, fines, fees and municipal court proceedings.

Animal Control Ordinance (Leash Law):

Under the Town's animal control ordinance, dogs must be leashed (leash is not to be more than seven feet in length and made of material strong enough to restrain the dog), in a vehicle or in an enclosure when off the dog owner's property. A dog on its owner's property must be restrained or enclosed with a fence, proper chain, etc.; or attended by a person who can control the dog. The animal control ordinance also covers several other aspects of keeping pets and animals. For more

information, please call the Police Department at (970) 963-2662. First time offenders who are reported to the RVRMA management may be counseled, offered a cure period and otherwise advised prior to additional punitive actions.

TIE ONE ON!

So many of us enjoy the companionship of our pets as we stroll to the Ranch House to grab a coffee and newspaper, or pick up mail, or participate in a Ranch House activity.

However, for the comfort of your pet and safety of all Ranch House users, you must tie up your pets **ONLY** at the tie-up stations provided. One is conveniently located on the grassy area in front of the Ranch House; two more are across the driveway from the Ranch House entrance under a nice, shady tree! All pet tie-ups are equipped with water bowls and doggie clean-up stations. Please **DO NOT** tie up your pet at the entrance of



the Ranch House, to the park bench, or to the bike rack. These are all high-traffic areas and even the most well-behaved pet can react if someone walks past quickly, or surprises them.
